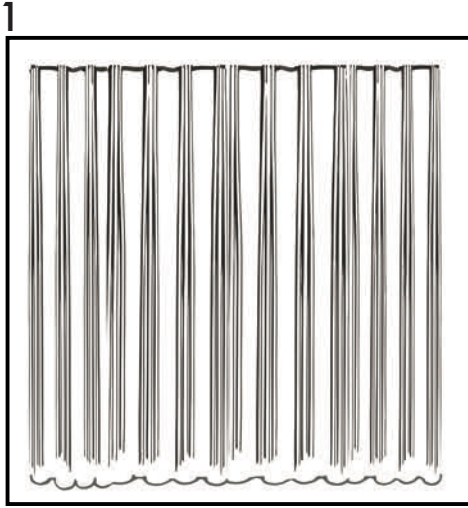


Pinch Pleat

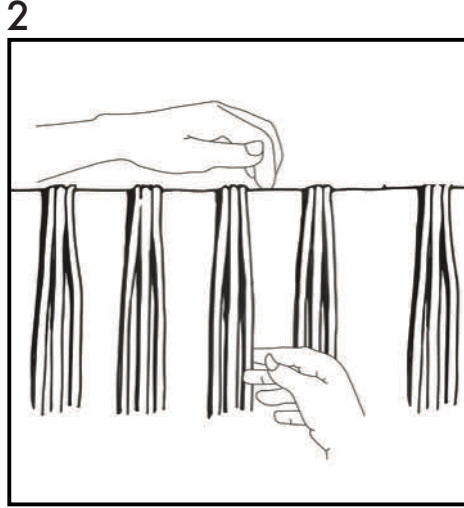
Hanging Instructions

To have a correct hanging pinch pleat curtain we advise the curtains are to be trained once hung. When this process is followed, your curtains will draw back into place neatly giving a maximum stack back and beautiful hanging curtain.

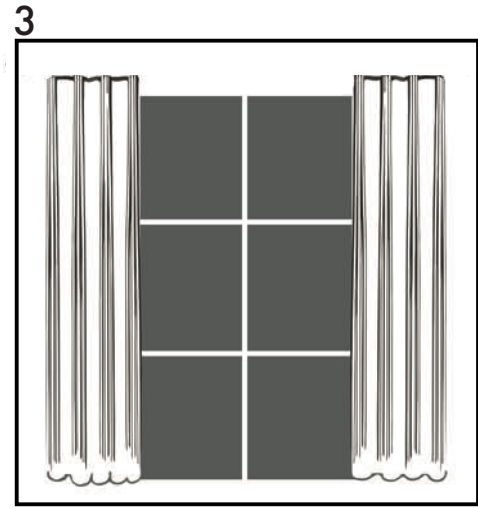
Hanging Your Curtains On a Track



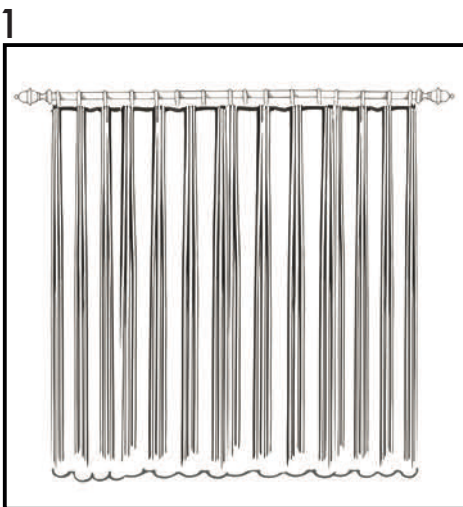
Hang your curtains by placing a hook into the first glider and then each glider thereafter. Once this is completed close your curtain/s to ensure they are the correct width and sit in place.



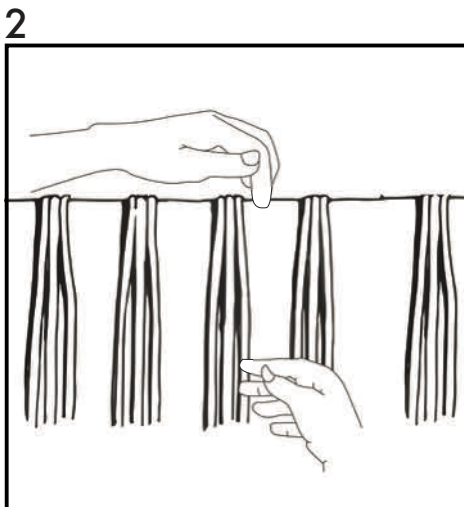
Starting at one end take each pleat back to one side. Place your finger in the middle of the pleats and pull this toward the front while pushing the pleat and fold along. Follow this process until all the curtain is back to the side. Then just run your fingers over the heading you pulled forward to give it a slight crease, this will make a memory in the heading for when they are opened and closed. Once you have completed this run your hands down the curtain to ensure the folds are working with the heading and not ballooning out. To hold them into place use strips of ribbon or something soft to tie around the curtain loosely. Try to leave your curtain like this for a few hours and then they can be closed.



Hanging Your Curtains On a Dec Rod



Hang your curtains by placing a hook into the first ring and then each ring thereafter. Once this is completed close your curtain/s to ensure they are the correct width and sit in place.



Starting at one end take each pleat back to one side. Place your finger in the middle of the pleats and push this toward the back while pushing the pleat and fold along. Follow this process until all the curtain is back to the side. Then just run your fingers over the heading you pulled back to give it a slight crease, this will make a memory in the heading for when they are opened and closed. Once you have completed this run your hands down the curtain to ensure the folds are working with the heading and not ballooning out. Try to leave your curtain like this for a few hours or even a full day and then they can be closed.
